




Entry Checklist

Please submit <u>all</u> items below by 3:00 pm, **Thursday, November 2, 2023.** Entries to be completed through digital form. **Questions?** Email: Adam Forte (aforte@bclna.com) Phone: 604-901-3301

Include the following electronic files:



- **Video submissions are now accepted.** Submit up to six 30 second videos. Videos that exceed 30 seconds will not be included in the submission for review by judges.
- Entry Form*
- Co-Entrant Waiver* and Client Consent*
- Project Description* for promotional purposes
- Company Biography*
- Questionnaire*. Answer questions as thoroughly as possible to tell the project's story
- Photo descriptions*
- Digital Image resolution (jpg or tiff files only) should be no less than 300 dpi. Images should not be smaller than **1200** x **1200** pixels. Digital cameras must

be set at a minimum of 3.2 megapixels for acceptable quality. Images must be numbered in sequence and identified as before and after.

Photos:

- Supply a maximum of 30 photos: minimum of 10 before photos, maximum of 20 after photos. Before and after's should be taken from the same vantage point
- A photo of the overall site must also be included for overall impression of your project
- Photos must not contain any information that would identify the entrant
- Images must not exceed 2 MB in size



Landscape design labeled with corresponding photo numbers:

Landscape design must not contain any information that would identify the entrant.

Payment via cheque, Visa or MasterCard:

- BCLNA members: \$180 first entry; \$120 subsequent entries; co-entrants pay an additional \$50
- Non-members: \$450 first entry; \$180 subsequent entries; co-entrants pay an additional \$100

stApplication forms can be completed through the APPLICATION FORM

No handwritten entries please.

Incomplete entries will be disqualified.

- Do not wet down stonework; this distorts the depth and darkens the photo.
- Snap shots during the first or last light of a sunny day, or when there are overcast skies.
- Take pictures from a variety of angles such as ariel view and points of interest (no plant close-ups).
- Sequence the photos as if you are walking through the landscape.
- Take before and after shots from approximately the same spot using the same scale
- Ensure the site is free of debris, tools, hoses, and litter—but don't overstyle the shot.
- Ensure all photos are taken at a minimum 300 dpi (set to the "largest" photo on your digital camera).
- Consider a professional for the best chance of having your photo on a magazine cover!







Photo requirements

Follow these important points to ensure judges see your awards entry in the best light.

- Include an electronic copy of each photo. Digital Image resolution (jpg or tiff files only)
- Should be no less than 300 dpi.
- Images should not be smaller than 1200 x 1200 pixels.
- Images must not exceed 2 MB in size. Digital cameras must be set at a minimum of 3.2 megapixels for acceptable quality.
- Images must be numbered in sequence and identified as before and after.
- Maintenance entries should submit photos from more than one season, as well as" before and after" of maintenance practices.
- Do not include any photos that identify your company (recognizable staff, company logos or signage). Identifiable entries will be disqualified.





Written requirements

Clear, concise descriptions help judges understand the challenges and successes of your project.

Download and complete the digital entry form at landscapebc.com No handwritten entries please. Ensure all sections are completed.

- 1. Entry form.
- 2. Client Consent & Co-Entrant Waiver Forms.
- 3. Project Description & Company Biography. These will be used for promotional purposes and press releases for winning projects. To help tell your story, be sure to highlight the most unique aspects and special achievements of your company, and the project.
- 4. Questionnaire. Your answers will help the judges better understand your project, and its challenges and successes.
- 5. Photo Descriptions. Provide a brief description (one or two sentences) of each photo; be sure to label the description with the corresponding photo file name.











Rules of entry and judging for the BC Landscape Awards of Excellence

- The BC Landscape Awards of Excellence is open to all landscape professionals operating in the province of British Columbia; entrants need not be BCLNA members.
- Eligible projects are those where the major portion of work has been contracted, executed, and/
 or designed by the entrant. When the designer or the installer is not the entrant or co-entrant, the
 designer or installer must be clearly identified on the application form, and give permission for the
 project to be entered.
- Entries are not compared or evaluated against one another, but against criteria of excellence. Judges score projects based on a points system. This allows diverse project types to be adjudicated on their own merits, and makes it possible to designate more than one Award of Excellence per category. An outline of the judging criteria is available upon request.
- Installation projects must have been completed less than three years prior to the entry deadline.
- Maintenance projects must be more than three years old, and must have been maintained by the entrant for a minimum of one year.
- Projects receiving a previous award may not be entered again in the same category, except
 maintenance sites, which may be re-entered by a different contractor, providing that the contractor
 has maintained it for a minimum of three years.
- Dollar values for entry categories must represent the total overall contract sale price of the completed project, not including applicable taxes.
- All entries must be accompanied by a complete set of digital forms. Download digital forms at www. landscapebc.com.
- Your client must be notified of your entry into the competition and must provide a signature on the consent form.
- Entries are evaluated by a panel of accredited judges that change yearly, and are chosen from various sectors of the horticulture industry including municipal & public gardens, nurseries, landscape trades, landscape architecture firms, educational institutions, garden communications, or garden centres.











Rules of entry and judging for the BC Landscape Awards of Excellence

- Entrants are not eligible to be judges.
- Judging criteria includes: completeness and quality of mandatory entry requirements, overall design and project creativity, technical merit of design, planting design, and landscape design plan elements
- Judges award points for each criterion to a total of 100 points. Winners are those projects achieving an average score of 85% or better.
- Judging criteria has been aligned with the National Awards of Landscape Excellence. The best BC projects submitted by BCLNA Members will be submitted to the following year's National Awards of Landscape Excellence. Non-members are eligible to win a BC Landscape Award of Excellence, **but these entries cannot be submitted to the National Awards**.
- Projects are presented to judges anonymously; the decision of the judges is final; decisions cannot be altered by staff, and cannot be appealed.
- Projects from the same value category will be grouped together but will be provided "blind" to the judges (i.e. without actual dollar value).
- Should the judges unanimously agree that a project is superior and worthy of outstanding mention, a Grand Award may be presented; multiple or no Grand Award winners may be named in a given year.
- All photos and entry documents become the property of the BC Landscape & Nursery Association and may be used in publications or for other purposes as deemed appropriate by the BCLNA.
